

2022 – 2023 HEDS Sexual Assault Campus Climate Survey: Undergraduates

Introduction:

The Higher Education Data Sharing Consortium (HEDS) is an organization of colleges and universities committed to sharing data, knowledge, and expertise. HEDS offers several educational impact surveys to help institutions assess the quality and impact of their programs.

The 2022 – 2023 HEDS Sexual Assault Campus Climate Survey asks students about their perceptions of Utica University's climate on unwanted sexual contact and sexual assault, their views of how the University addresses and responds to sexual assault, and whether they have experienced sexual assault.

New York State law requires that institutions conduct a climate survey every other year to assess the extent to which a college or university is complying with legislation related to sexual assault, dating violence, stalking prevention, and institutional response policies and procedures. The 2022 – 2023 HEDS Sexual Assault Campus Climate Survey includes questions required by this legislation.

The survey was administered in Fall 2022 to undergraduates aged 18 years and older on the main campus as well as the two additional locations in Syracuse and Latham. Given the nature and sensitive content of the survey, no advertising was done urging students to respond, and no incentives were offered. Students received an invitation to complete the survey via their utica.edu email. Only one additional reminder was sent.

A total of 96 undergraduates completed the survey, representing a response rate of 4.75%.

Reported here are the valid percentages for each survey item. More complete results are available from the Office of Institutional Effectiveness.
